From Canon David:

#### *Covid-19 Important Information*

Unfortunately the school chaplain we have staying in Cathedral House tested positive for Covid-19 on Tuesday evening 19th October. He is isolating in his room for the recommended 10 day period, which will end on Sunday 31st October. We have tried to inform all those we think he had been in contact with. The advice I have received from the Diocese is that Eddie and I should test for Covid-19 daily and only isolate if there is a positive result from these tests or we develop symptoms. We have both been double vaccinated. At the time of writing the tests have been negative and we have no symptoms. Mass and the other sacraments will therefore continue to be celebrated publicly as long as I continue with negative test results and have no symptoms. Should that situation change we will send out an e-mail and post a message on the Parish website. The usual precautions at Mass must continue and just to remind you these are face coverings (unless exempt), hand sanitising and social distance – there is enough space in the Cathedral for this to happen. It is recommended by the Government to test yourself for Covid-19 regularly if that is possible. When preparing for and presiding at Mass and also when I distribute Holy Communion I will continue to sanitise my hands, wear a face covering and keep a safe distance (an arm's length) behind the kneeler. Thank you for your cooperation and please keep us all in your prayers. With my best wishes and prayers, Canon David

#### **POPE FRANCIS' synod is coming to Arundel!**

As you may know the Holy Father has just opened a synod about *The Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission*. Broadly speaking, it is a listening exercise where people have a chance to give their views on specific questions. The Cathedral Team will collate the responses and send them to Bishop Richard, who in turn will collate the diocesan responses and send them on to Rome. Pope Francis will then absorb the reports from the worldwide Church, and in 2023 the Synod of Bishops will discuss the results before implementing its decisions.

Practically speaking, this means we will arrange opportunities for people to meet, discuss the questions and feedback their views **in December** as Rome has set a tight schedule. There will be options to meet in person, on Zoom, and to submit something in writing. We want this to be prayerful activity, so we will have Adoration before each meeting as an essential part of the process.

Please watch this space for more details as we get closer to December and pray for the work of the Synod.

**AN 'ASSISTED DYING' BILL** was due to be debated in the House of Lords on **22<sup>nd</sup> October**. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it.
